Bankruptcy Symposium April 22

4/15/05--The American College of Bankruptcy and the Boston College Law Review are pleased to present "A Symposium on the Future of Chapter 11" on April 22 at Boston College Law School, in East Wing room 115. The daylong program will include a luncheon and will conclude with a cocktail party.

The symposium will focus on the most pressing issues facing the bench and bar in small and large business cases. Practical solutions within the framework of the Code will be discussed, as well as the potential effect of S. 256, the Bankruptcy Abuse Prevention and Consumer Protection Act of 2005 (if passed), on Chapter 11 cases.
